If you are not familiar with Episcopal Church worship, we have tried to make our worship bulletin easy to follow. This service of Morning Prayer can be found on page 75 in the Book of Common Prayer. However, all of the prayers and responses for the congregation are printed in the bulletin.



Saint Andrew's is a parish of the Episcopal Church within the Diocese of Upper South Carolina. Over time, our identity as a parish has come to be defined by our commitment to worship in the distinctive splendor of Anglo-Catholic tradition, to witness through word and deed to the life changing implications of Jesus Christ's reconciling love, and to welcome unreservedly all God's children into Christ's Body, the Church.



In the midst of this time of social distancing, we are offering this outdoor service of Morning Prayer at 8:30 AM to allow for more individuals to gather on the church grounds to worship together. In order to this safely, however, we are requiring that everyone participating in this service wear face masks while gathering and departing and maintain at least three foot social distancing from anyone who is not a member of your household.

Covenant for In-Person Worship

Please note that those attending worship at this time commit themselves to the following norms:

- If you have any symptoms associated with COVID-19, you will not attend in-person worship.
- If you develop symptoms or are diagnosed after a liturgy, you will report it immediately to the priest.
- You will not attempt to shake hands or hug anyone, and will do your best to maintain a distance of 3 feet from anyone outside of your family group.
- You will wash your hands immediately before coming to worship.
- You will wear a mask at all times when inside church buildings.

Morning Prayer, Rite II

As you gather for our service of Holy Eucharist, please remember that three foot distancing should be maintained with respect to anyone outside of your household. Once you are at your seat for the service, you are invited to remove your mask if desired. After the opening announcements, the Officiant will invite you to stand for the opening of the service.

Opening Sentence of Scripture

Hebrews 9:24

Officiant Christ has entered, not into a sanctuary made with hands, a copy of the true one, but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf.

The Confession and Absolution

Officiant Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

A period of silence is observed.

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Officiant Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you 4 all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**

Christ our Passover has been sacrificed for us; *

therefore let us keep the feast,

Please sit for the reading of the Psalm and the First Lesson.

Psalm 1 (antiphonally by whole verse as directed by the Officiant)

- Happy are they who have not walked in the counsel of the wicked, * nor lingered in the way of sinners, nor sat in the seats of the scornful!
- Their delight is in the law of the Lord, * and they meditate on his law day and night.
- They are like trees planted by streams of water, bearing fruit in due season, with leaves that do not wither; * everything they do shall prosper.
- It is not so with the wicked; * they are like chaff which the wind blows away.
- Therefore the wicked shall not stand upright when judgment comes, * nor the sinner in the council of the righteous.
- ⁶ For the Lord knows the way of the righteous, * but the way of the wicked is doomed.

The Lessons

First Lesson Acts 1:15-17, 21-26

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred twenty persons) and said, "Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus—for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry. So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection." So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, "Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place." And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.

Second Lesson 1 John 5:9-13

If we receive human testimony, the testimony of God is greater; for this is the testimony of God that he has testified to his Son. Those who believe in the Son of God have the testimony in their hearts. Those who do not believe in God have made him a liar by not believing in the testimony that God has given concerning his Son. And this is the testimony: God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life. I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life.

Please stand for the reading of the Canticle.

Please sit for the Lesson and Homily. Whereas, in a Holy Eucharist service, we stand for the proclamation of the Gospel, it is appropriate to sit for the Gospel reading in a Morning Prayer service.

The Gospel John 17:6-19

Jesus prayed for his disciples saying, "I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you have given me is from you; for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. I am asking on their behalf; I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours. All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one. While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost, so that the scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves. I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. They do

not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth."

Day of Pentecost, Sunday, May 23 | Next Sunday, we will celebrate the Day of Pentecost, when we recall how the gift of the Holy Spirit descended upon those early disciples gathered in Jerusalem after Jesus' Ascension, as recorded in the second chapter of Acts. Pentecost, which means "the fiftieth day," is always celebrated on the fiftieth day of the Easter Season—marking the end of the Easter Season and the beginning of the long Season after Pentecost. Pentecost is also a day on which the church traditionally provides the opportunity for Holy Baptism, and, though we do not have any baptisms scheduled for next Sunday, we will join in the renewal of our baptismal vows in recognition of that aspect of Pentecost.

Reminder: Parking Options at Saint Andrew's

- 1. Old Pendleton Street Baptist Church Parking Lot (immediately beside and behind the church property)
- Sundays All available spots are open to folks who are coming to Saint Andrew's for worship.
- Weeknights & Saturdays All available spots are open to folks who are coming to Saint Andrew's for worship or other church-related activities. (Availability may be limited due to baseball or other events.)
- Weekday Business Hours Up to five open spots (preferably the spots closest to the stairs from the parking lot-numbered 101 to 105) are available for Saint Andrew's parishioners and staff here for church-related events.
- 2. Ground Floor of Homewood Suites Parking Garage (across N. Markley Street from Parish Hall)
- · Weeknights, Weeknights, Weekends (including Sunday mornings), and Holidays (NOT during Weekday Business Hours - If you have a church parking decal on your car window-and you are coming to worship or any other church event, you can park in the ungated ground floor of the Homewood Suites Parking Garage outside of regular business day hours. Make sure to park in the spots with red and white signs that say "Warning: Permit Parking Only." Your Saint Andrew's decal is considered your permit. If you need a decal, please contact the office.
- 3. Street Parking on North Markley and South Main Please note that some of the spots on North Markley have signage indicating "Church Parking SUN 9:30 AM-2:00 PM, WED 5:30 PM-8:00 PM. If you park in those spots without a Saint Andrew's Church window decal, you may receive a parking fine.
