First Lesson

Acts 2:1-21

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs-in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine." But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Holy Baptism

Presentation and Examination of the Candidate

After the Sermon, the congregation remains seated as the candidate for Holy Baptism and their sponsor comes forward to the altar rail for the presentation and examination. (The entire liturgy can be found on page 301 of the prayer book. Congregational responses are provided below.)

After the candidate is presented and examined, the Celebrant invites the people to stand and addresses them as follows Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this person in their life in Christ?

People We will.

The Baptismal Covenant

Celebrant Let us join with Nyx in committing ourselves to Christ as we renew our own baptismal covenants.

Do you believe in God the Father?

People I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

- Celebrant Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
- People I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

- People I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the Φ resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.
- *Celebrant* Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers? *People* I will, with God's help.
- Celebrant Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord? People I will, with God's help.
- Celebrant Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?
- People I will, with God's help.
- Celebrant Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?
- People I will, with God's help.
- *Celebrant* Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?*People* I will, with God's help.

Prayers for the Candidate

During the Prayers for the Candidate, the procession to the baptismal font occurs.

Celebrant Let us now pray for this person who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

- Intercessor Deliver Nyx, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.
- People Lord, hear our prayer.
- Intercessor Open Nyx's heart to thy grace and truth.
- People Lord, hear our prayer.
- Intercessor Fill Nyx with thy holy and lifegiving spirit.
- People Lord, hear our prayer.
- Intercessor Keep Nyx in the faith and communion of thy holy Church.
- People Lord, hear our prayer.
- Intercessor Teach Nyx to love others in the power of the Spirit.
- People Lord, hear our prayer.
- Intercessor Send Nyx into the world in witness to thy love.
- People Lord, hear our prayer.
- Intercessor Bring Nyx to the fullness of thy peace and glory.
- People Lord, hear our prayer.
- *Celebrant* Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ thy Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and forever. **Amen.**

Thanksgiving over the Water

CelebrantThe Lord be with you.PeopleAnd with thy spirit.CelebrantLet us give thanks unto our Lord God.PeopleIt is meet and right so to do.

The Celebrant continues

We give thee thanks, Almighty God, for the gift of water, over which thy Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation; through which thou didst lead the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise; in which thy Son Jesus Christ received the baptism of John and the anointing of the Holy Spirit, being manifested thereby as the Messiah, the Christ, who leadeth us, through his precious death and mighty resurrection, from the bondage of sin unto life everlasting.

We give thee thanks, O Father, for the water of Baptism, in which we are buried with Christ in his death; by which we partake of his resurrection; through which we are made regenerate of the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to thy Son, we bring into his fellowship them that come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water, we beseech thee, by thy Holy Spirit, that those here cleansed from sin and made regenerate may continue forever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior, to whom, with thee and the same Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and forever. **Amen.**

After the water has been blessed, the font is censed by the Celebrant.

Baptism, Chrismation, and Presentation of the Baptismal Candle

The candidate steps forward to the font. The Celebrant then continues with the following, and the people respond as indicated. Nyx, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Nyx, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. Amen.

Nyx, receive the light of Christ that you may be a light to the world. Amen.

After the Baptismal Candle has been presented, the procession back to the chancel takes place as the Celebrant asperges the people using the blessed water from the baptismal font.

Prayer over the Newly Baptized

Celebrant Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank thee that by water and the Holy Spirit thou hast bestowed upon thy servant Nyx the forgiveness of sin, and hast raised Nyx to the new life of grace. Sustain Nyx, O Lord, in thy Holy Spirit. Give Nyx an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love thee, and the gift of joy and wonder in all thy works. **Amen.**

Welcoming the Newly Baptized

Celebrant Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All We receive you into the household of God: Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

The Peace

Celebrant The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People And with thy spirit.

Then the ministers and people may greet one another in the name of the Lord.

Birthday and Anniversary Blessings

After the exchange of the Peace, the Celebrant invites those celebrating their birthdays or anniversaries to come forward. If anyone comes forward, the Celebrant invites the people to join in the following prayer.

All Almighty and gracious God, we give thee thanks for each of these thy servants as they celebrate their special day. Watch over them as they begin another year, and give them grace to keep the vows and promises they have made. Bless and guide them wherever they may be; strengthen them when they stand; raise them up if they fall; comfort them when discouraged or sorrowful; and may thy peace which passes all understanding abide in their hearts all the days of their lives; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Holy Communion

After the opportunity for birthday and anniversary blessings, the Celebrant says an Offertory Sentence and returns to the altar. Then, after the people's offering of bread and wine are brought forward, the people sit during the Offertory Anthem as the altar is set and other offerings are collected from the people. (An offering can also be made by placing it in the offering plate located on the table in the aisle by the font or online at www.standrewsgreenville.org/giving.)


After the Offertory Anthem, the choir is censed. Then the people stand, are censed, and remain standing as the other offerings are brought forward and received with the following words.

Then, facing the Holy Table, the Celebrant chants the Preface and Proper Preface followed by

The people kneel or stand as the Celebrant continues, speaking the Eucharistic prayer on behalf of the people (full text found on page 340 of the prayer book). As the prayer is concluding, the Celebrant chants the following, and the people respond with the Great Amen.

The Breaking of the Bread

The Celebrant breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept before the following is sung.



Invitation to Communion

After the Blessed Sacrament has been distributed to the altar party, the choir, and the newly baptized, all are welcome to come forward to the altar rail at the direction of the ushers. At the altar rail, all baptized Christians are invited to receive the Blessed Sacrament, and those who are not yet baptized are invited to indicate a desire to receive a blessing by crossing their arms upon arrival at the altar rail. (Our rector is always eager to speak with anyone who is not yet baptized about preparing for and receiving the sacrament of Baptism.)

For those receiving the Blessed Sacrament, a wafer will be placed in the palm of your hand or upon your tongue after which the chalice is offered. If you need a gluten-free wafer, you may request one from the priest at the altar rail. Should you wish to receive wine by intinction (dipping), allow the chalice bearer to take the wafer from your open palm and intinct for you. Should you be unable to manage the steps, please notify one of the ushers so that Holy Communion can be administered at your pew.
